#### **Monitoring and Evaluation:**

Often is undertaken at project level

\* Forms a critical component in management decision making

Has been silo managed – limited coordinated system for data and information sharing on impact of investments



### **Strategies**

1. Develop an Integrated Knowledge Management System (IKMS)

2. Develop a standard M&E tool

3. Collect, collate, disaggregate, analyze, publish and disseminate periodic M&E reports



4. Leverage on current and future innovations in ICT such as e-government, Huduma Centres, county information and resource centres, and integrated population registration systems

#### **Conclusion**

ME&L should be a management decision tool for both national government and county governments

Implementation of a coordinated IKMS will ensure improved delivery of projects and programs objectives and expected results; accountability in utilization of resources; and enhanced access to evidence-based data and information
