Impact of Covid -19

- Physical access has been restricted
- Safety of the monitoring and evaluation team is paramount- provision of ppes, sanitizers
- What about m/e ?
 - Either put it on hold
 - Continue
 - Perform only critical M/E

Management of the m/e process

- ❑ M/E team- selection and capacity building of the team based on locality of projects. Use of local communities.
- ❑ Data collection
 - Use of technology (kdsp) gps enabled phones
 - Mobile surveys
 - Whatsap / face book
 - Radio intereactive sessions
 - Local communities, organizations

Data Collection

- Ethical issues

- Obtaining informed consent, bias
- Written to verbal, recording people
- Making respondents stay on phone
- Compensation of respondents
- Photographs

- Data security

- Uploading data to secure servers.

Challenges of Data Quality Management

- Completeness
- Uniqueness- a lot of duplication
- Timeliness- availability when needed and up to date
- Validity
- Reliability
- Accuracy- correctness of measurements
- Consistency-uniform information

Recomendations

- Covid – 19 has brought about social distancing that limits access and interactions
- Organizations need to identify critical and non critical M/E
